Hi St. John's Community,

I am pleased to announce that boys' volleyball registrations will be completed online this year. In order to register you will need to log into the website below, click on our parish and then athletics and it will take you to the athletic association's web page. From there you will need to create an account if you haven't done so already. The Volleyball fee is \$50 and if you haven't paid the one time family fee for the year it will be due at the same time as your volleyball registration fee. Volleyball registration will be open through February 13th; no registrations will be accepted after this date. Assessment dates will be communicated after this date and will depend on the number of boys registered.

Volleyball teams are setup in the following format:

3rd/4th grade instructional – With this age group the primary focus is introducing and developing the boys skills and to get as many touches on the volleyball as possible. Assessments are not completed for this age group. The league requires that 3rd/4th grade be mixed and that we don't have all 3rd grade teams or all 4th grade teams.

5th/6th and 7th/8th grade teams – The league has levels for these age groups, A, B1, and B. We will do assessments for these age groups and the teams will be determined and communicated after the assessments are completed.

The volleyball season typically starts in the middle of March and ends the end of May with the City Tournament.

We offer a variety of styles as well as rhinestone options for you to choose from when considering spirit wear for you or your family. School spirit wear can be purchased in two ways:

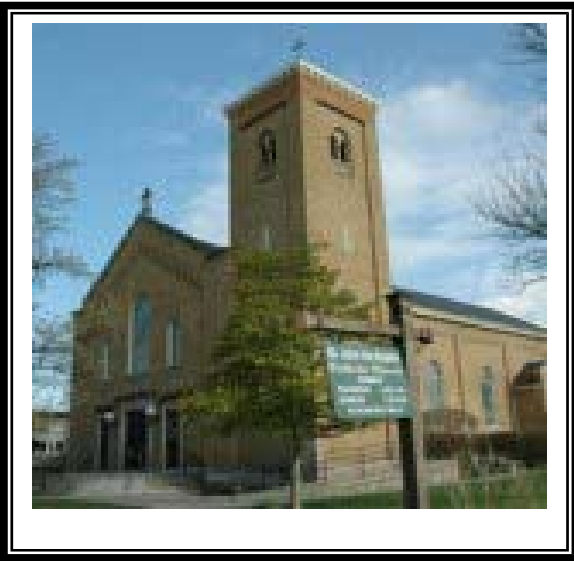
- 1) In the fall & spring, families can place an order and it will be delivered to the students at school.

The Greater Cincinnati Performing Arts Society will present the a cappella group Cadence to the St. Xavier Performance Center Saturday February 28 at 7:30 PM. Cadence hails from Toronto Canada and has been nominated for 3 Juno awards (Canadian Grammys) and their recordings have won 10 a cappella awards. When their four voices fill the air, their melodies unfurl into something both familiar and fresh. What comes next may be a classic song by Joni Mitchell or Louis Prima. It may be an old bebop standard or cheeky arrangement of a 1980s hit. But these are arrangements like you've never heard them before—containing all the richness of a full band, but performed using just four voices. In fact, at times during the show, you will need to do a double take as they sound like an entire band, yet there is not one instrument on stage.
