## A MESSAGE FROM MRS. MEYMANN

**Congratulations** to our two second grade classes who have just celebrated the Sacrament of First Holy Communion. At this week's school Mass, these students performed "Our God is an Awesome God" for the rest of the student body and proudly joined grades 3-8 in receiving the gift of Jesus at Mass. After Mass, Father Kemper prayed over their new crosses and rosaries, providing a blessing. Please pray for our students who have recently received this Sacrament and for all those receiving a new Sacrament in the coming weeks. As a school, we will be having May Crowning, following our May 13th Mass. We have a tradition of having students bring in flowers to surround Mary as well. Please bring your bouquets to school on the morning of Friday, May 13th.

Last Friday our staff spent the afternoon reviewing safety procedures, particularly in the event of being alerted to dangerous intruders in the school or within the Harrison community. Several police departments joined forces in order to give each teacher practice in dealing with an experience we pray to avoid, that of having an active shooter in or near the school. Officers who have been trained in teaching students how to deal with active shooters will be presenting to our students on May 5th. Teachers have viewed the training videos in preparation for helping guide their students through drills. The student assemblies will divide the children by grade levels and each is geared toward the developmental level of that age group. For example, the message for the younger students is presented in an upbeat, entertaining video in which the main lessons include the importance of listening to the teacher's directions and "building a tower" which translates (for adults) into barricading the door. The older students are given more details and practice examples, but no graphic or frightening content is presented.

Although not a single American school has experienced a fire since a Chicago parochial school burned in 1958, all schools now practice monthly fire drills. With news reports on violent crimes in schools several times each year, it is clear all schools need to practice preparedness for possible crisis situations. St. John the Baptist will be the first school in the Harrison community to actively prepare students for such an emergency. Thank you to our PTC meeting attendees for initiating contact between the Harrison Police Department and the Delhi Police Department in order to make this a possibility and to expand our efforts to help keep our students safe.

**All students residing in the Southwest Local School District should return the transportation request forms being sent home.** Even if your child will only occasionally require bus transportation, please complete and return these important forms. The transportation department must have this information before students may be included in any bus route. Please return them to school by May 25.

St. John PTC is now accepting nominations for the following Board positions. Each position has a 2-year term which will begin with the 2016/2017 school year.

- President

The **PTC Board President** is responsible for the following tasks:

- Preside over PTC meetings.
- Create Agenda for PTC meetings.
- Communicate with principal often on various PTC activities.
- Oversee all PTC committees.
- Delegate a committee for Catholic Schools Week.
- Write updated information of PTC (current deadline for Jaguar Journal is Thursday 3:00 pm) and provide to secretary of PTC for publication.
- Attend or assign other PTC Board member to attend 8<sup>th</sup> grade graduation to award PTC scholarships.
- Meet with PTC Board members and establish the budget for the next school year.
- Call special meetings when necessary.
- Review By-Laws yearly at a PTC meeting.

The **PTC Board Marketing** position is a new position. It is anticipated that the Marketing position will be responsible for the following tasks:

- Chair marketing initiatives for Open House, preschool, and kindergarten round-up.
- Assemble and arrange for distribution of Welcome Kits.
- Launch PTC on three social media sites, owning the content development for each.
- Serve as community manager on all digital platforms.
- Find and execute future marketing opportunities.
- Recommend marketing opportunities to the PTC Board for vote.
- Update the PTC webpage as appropriate.

The **PTC Board Secretary** is responsible for the following tasks:

- Keep a written record (minutes) of each PTC meeting.
- Provide minutes at each meeting from the previous PTC meeting for approval vote.
- Provide copies of PTC By-Laws at each meeting and/or upon request.
- Submit copies of the PTC meeting minutes to the school's webmaster to be published online.
- Type updated PTC By-Laws as needed.
- Submit to school secretary and / or school's webmaster reminder of PTC meetings and events in advance (minimum of two weeks) for publication in the Jaguar Journal and / or other means of communication.
- Submit PTC meetings and events that have been secured for the following school year to school secretary by deadline (Usually at beginning of August).

With your help, St. John the Baptist parish can look forward to renewed generosity. Keep in mind that this program has no effect on the personal fuel points you accumulate and earn for gas purchases from your shopping; fuel points are still yours to keep and use.
