Thanks to the supreme efforts of our Technology Committee members, such issues as being unable to print or delays in homework postings have been very few. Be sure to check out the technology updates below and continue submitting concerns or questions through the technology committee link. Teachers in grades 6-8 appreciate the busy schedules of families. All have agreed to make sure assignments have been posted online before the 4:15 p.m. general message is distributed. If teachers are absent, it may be impossible to send out a complete schedule of assignments, but we will do our best. Students are doing a wonderful job of staying within the crosswalks while moving through the parking lot in the morning. Parents are staying in the single drop off lane or parking to walk younger students to their classrooms. Thank you for following our safety rules. Thanks to all the staff members who have been so helpful and welcoming to our new teachers. We are all united in our mission to work together to bring the best educational experiences we can to our students in a faith-filled setting.

What is Ascend and how is it Useful to My Family? By now, you have hopefully signed into your child's Ascend account. Ascend Student Management System is a hosted platform for managing attendance, grades, conduct, health, lunch and parent communication. If you have not yet logged on, please note you will be prompted to CHANGE your password. You can also LINK all your children's accounts together, in order to login just once, and view multiple children's grades, etc. from one screen. Teachers can post detailed homework assignments and due dates, as well as items to bring to school or comments and messages for specific students or classes. Missing work may be counted as "pending" rather than as a low grade, if the teacher has his or her gradebook set up in this manner. This is very helpful for students who are absent. Registrations and report cards may be recorded through the Ascend portal as well and printed for your convenience in sharing with your student. Something for parents to look forward to is the ability to set up a cafeteria account on Ascend. By uploading money into your child's lunchroom account, you will have no need to send in cash with your child, and will be able to quickly see how much money remains in your account. We hope to offer this convenience to families in the next few weeks!

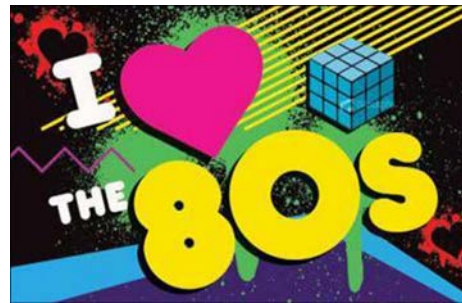

X-PERIENCE NIGHTS

St. Xavier High School hosts six X-perience Nights in October (*3, 11, 13, 17, 19 & 25*). Your school and all 7th & 8th grade families will receive an invitation to attend. While we hope families can join on the specific evening of your school's invitation, they certainly can attend any night that best fits their schedule.

The evening begins in our Chapel of the Holy Companions at 6:30 p.m. and concludes at 8 p.m. Parents will hear a presentation about the mission of St. Xavier from the parent of a current student, faculty member, and an admissions representative – with ample time for questions and answers afterward.
